GMG NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY


The GMG NHS Induction Ceremony will be held Thursday, November 7th at 7 PM in the high school Cafeteria.

One week later, one of our chrysalises hatched. We tagged him and released him to make the migration to Mexico








Gladbrook Fire Department at GMG Elementary

The day was held in conjunction with National Fire Prevention Week

October 7 to 12. Firemen attending included Fire Chief Matt Koester, Assistant Fire Chief Dan DeWitt, Secretary/Treasurer Mark Lowry, Lt. Craig Sash and Firefighter Landon Read.

The schedule is designed with a different activity for each grade level. The AM Preschool watched as the firemen demonstrated fire gear and the equipment they wear. The rain stopped and the Afternoon Preschool even got to go outside and get up on the truck and hear the siren and very loud horn.

The Kindergartners were instructed what to do if a fire alarm goes off in their home. They were also told the importance of having a designated family meeting place and practiced the belly crawl to stay below any heat and smoke.

The second graders were taught proper evacuation from home or school. And they learned the importance of an alternative escape route.

Third graders got to try on the firemen attire and race in a relay to see which group could dress the fastest. They learned first hand how heavy and cumbersome the gear is, but how important it is for the firemen s' safety when on the job.

Fourth graders practiced first hand what to do in case there is a bus accident and what it is like to have the bus fill with smoke. The firemen used the smoke simulator to give the students an experience with smoke. They learned the various exits on the bus and how very important it is to listen carefully to instructions from the driver.

The sixth graders received hands on training in the use of a fire extinguisher. This included a live burn simulation with extinguishment.

The fifth graders rounded out the day using the water hoses from the truck to tip over a safety cone, shut off the water, set the cone back up and race back to tag next person in line. They learned that there is a lot of pressure in the hoses and it takes a lot of strength and concentration to use the water hose properly.

The firemen are to be commended for volunteering their time and bringing the fire truck and water tank for the students to view first hand. Feed back as to what the students learned and took home to share with family members has been impressive. The GMG Elementary students are very lucky to have this opportunity and an activity to look forward to each year. Fire Chief Matt Koester said this program is intended to give the students something to look forward to each year as the program covers something different for each grade..



These fourth grade girls shared some of the things thy learned during the bus evacuation practice. Lexi Rosedale (far left) said, "I learned that if the bus tips and you are underneath something don't try to get up by yourself. Get help." Lilie Rosedale (center) noted, "I didn't know the windows were marked for exiting and there a lot of other exits". Tyler Mathern (far right) commented, "I learned we need to sit down and give the bus driver our full attention to get directions as to what to do. I learned there will be different escape routes used in different situations."

The GMG Afternoon Preschool is pictured with the big firetruck. They even got to crawl up on the big rig.

Mark Lowry is pictured with a GMG Fifth grader who is using the water hose to try and knock down a cone. The activity divided the class into two teams and the goal was to aim the water to knock over the cone, shut of the water flow, run to set up the cone and rush back to tag the next in line. The children learned there is a lot of pressure and force in the hoses and they must be hung on to very securely to make sure no one gets hurt if they were to flip around unattended.



From the Principal's Desk

Dear GMG Parents and Community,

Our district strives to be as transparent as possible when making any decision that effects our students. We take special attention when it comes to how we spend money on different programs at GMG, whether spending is for academics or for activities. We do this so all district stakeholders can see what we are doing and that it is in the best interest of our students. If we all have a common starting point, we can have an open dialogue in any instance where a discrepancy occurs. I often refer to the following when deciding what to share, "In absence of information; people make up their own facts." We try to provide as much information as we can.

It has come to our attention that even though we provide a detailed spending report at board meetings, we can do a better job showcasing some of the major purchases we make for our students. With this thought in mind, I would like to detail some of the items we have purchased over the past few months and highlighting the organizations who have helped support our school and students.

Baseball Uniforms-Free from Adidas during the summer.

Football Helmets-Purchased this fall out of the schools general fund, approved by the school board.

Air Conditioning Unit for Secondary Gym & Locker Room Areas-Purchased through SAVE Funds at district level, approved by the school board.

English/Language Arts Secondary Curriclulum-Purchased this summer out of the school General Fund, approved by the school board.

Science Secondary Curriculum-Purchased this fall out of the school General Fund, approved by the school board.

Ice Maker Secondary Cafeteria-Purchased through the school Nutrition Fund.

Technology Upgrades Secondary Building-Purchased through a Federal Program known as E-Rate.

All of GMG's bills and financials are posted monthly on our board site, along with our monthly board minutes.

As we continue our journey to be as transparent as we possibly can in our purchases for the school and student activities, we will be posting any major purchases on our social media accounts. We appreciate our working relationship with the GMG Boosters as they continue to support our school, students, activities, and organizations.

If you ever have any questions, please reach out and contact me at the school. I would like to hear from you and ensure that everyone in our community and all of our stakeholders have as much information as possible.

The Board expects that students, employees and visitors will treat each other with respect, engage in responsible behavior, exercise self-discipline and model fairness, equity and respect. Individuals violating this policy will be subject to discipline. Students will be disciplined consistent with the student conduct policies. Employees will be disciplined consistent with employee discipline policies and laws. Others will be subject to discipline according to this policy.

Individuals are permitted to attend school sponsored or approved activities or visit school premises only as guests of the school district, and, as a condition, they must comply with the school district's rules and policies. Individuals will not be allowed to interfere with or disrupt the education program or activity. Visitors, like the participants, are expected to display mature, responsible behavior. The failure of individuals to do so is not only disruptive but embarrassing to the students, the school district and the entire community.

To protect the rights of students to participate in the education program or activities without fear of interference or disruption and to permit the school officials, employees and activity sponsors and officials to perform their duties without interference or disruption, the following provisions are in effect:

- Abusive, verbal or physical conduct of individuals directed at students, school officials, employees, officials and activity sponsors of sponsored or approved activities or at other individuals will not be tolerated. Nor will the use of vulgar, obscene or demeaning language or expressions.
- Verbal or physical conduct of individuals that interferes with the performance of students, school
 officials, employees, officials and activity sponsors of sponsored or approved activities will not be
 tolerated.
- Spectators and parents should have no interactions with officials before, during, or after a game, nor
 with coaches or players from any school during an event besides positive and supportive comments.
 If you wish to visit with a coach, you should communicate that request at least one day after the
 event; not directly following an activity.

If an individual becomes physically or verbally abusive, uses vulgar, obscene or demeaning expression, or in any way interrupts an activity or otherwise violates the above provisions, the individual may be removed from the event by the individual in charge of the event, or other school administrator. School staff in charge of the event or administrators reserve the right to remove any individual/s that are deemed to be displaying excessively disrespectful or unsportsmanlike behavior towards any student-athletes, officials, coach, or any other individuals present at a school event.

Individuals removed from school premises will be excluded from attending any and all school events, home or away, for a minimum of 14 days. Excluded individuals have the ability to follow the Board's chain of command and complaint policies should they choose to do so. The exclusion is in effect should the individual choose to appeal the decision of the superintendent. The term "individual" as used in the policy also includes students and employees.

If an individual has been notified of exclusion and thereafter tries to enter a school building or attends a sponsored or approved activity, the individual will be advised that his/her attendance will result in prosecution and long-term or permanent exclusion from school buildings and grounds. The school district may obtain a court order for permanent exclusion from school buildings or from future school

The elementary is participating in an outreach program where the students will be packaging meals for the needy. The FAST assessments are completed for the fall. The first round of grade level data team meetings have been held, in which literacy interventions were discussed, based off the results of the fall assessments.

Mr. Kleinmeyer reported there have been some condensation issues in the high school building, resulting from the AC installation. The new bells and intercom system are installed and running smoothly.
