The GMG Board of Education met in regular session, on Monday, March 8, 2021, at 6:30 PM, electronically through Zoom Video Conferencing and also in the cafeteria at the GMG High School in Garwin. Kyle Hall called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Members present were Kyle Hall, Doug Dieleman, Nathan Holven, Ann Jackson, Jill Roberts, Randy Sienknecht, and Jackie Stonewall. Also present were Ben Petty, Chris Frimml, Nathan Kleinmeyer, Katie Mathern, Heidi Langenbau, and Curt Bacon.

Reports:

Mr. Frimml reported there are currently seventeen students signed up for preschool next year. Last year at this time, twelve students were signed up. On March 22nd there will be a professional development day. The teachers in the lower elementary will be focused on making sure there is a clear map and logical sequence to phonics instruction, while the upper elementary will be working on the ISASP.

Mr. Kleinmeyer reported at the secondary, they are working through the end of the year boiler fixes and steam trap replacements. The next book for the book study with staff is "Unthinking Learning," which will begin in April. In baseball and softball, pitchers and catchers have started practicing. There are good numbers for track and coaches have hit their stride with the new structure. Golf can start soon. Currently there are two boys and four to six girls signed up.

GMG FOUNDATION NEWS

Grateful and Hopeful

So when I took over as treasurer of the foundation in the fall, I had to figure out how it all worked, but we had a *bigger problem*. We had money to cover the scholarships for now, but general donations to the foundation were dwindling. We were not able to award as many scholarships as we had in the past.

So we brainstormed options and decided to launch a Foundation website, open a PayPal account as another way for people to donate, and post using social media to help. I posted a call for help on December 5, 2020, on the "you know you are from Garwin site."

The results have been **ASTOUNDING**! Since that post and the launch of our website we have had **34 new donors**. Individual donations have ranged from \$20 to \$1000. It leaves me humbled and speechless as I think about it. In addition, we have started several new scholarships. The <u>Class of 2002</u> came through with four new scholarships: one for academics, one for fine arts, one for athletics, and one as the Garrett Stephenson Memorial Scholarship. People who retired from GMG started a <u>Retired Staff</u> <u>Scholarship</u>. The <u>Garwin Church Women</u> have also donated money to be used for a scholarship in their name.

That takes care of the **Grateful**, now for the **Hopeful**. We will be able to give more scholarships than we did last year. We have made gains, but are still not back to previous levels of funds. We are still hoping that as we engage more people, we can receive more individual donations. So, I will close with one quick story. My son, James, set up the website and I registered our bank account with PayPal. I'm writing the post for the Garwin facebook page, and I'm thinking, "What if no one donates? All this work down the drain, that's going to feel bad." Amazingly enough 20 minutes after my post, I get a notification that we have had our first donation from PayPal. It was from a foreign exchange student who attended our school in 1977. That was the first and best gift given. We had touched her life enough to donate money to our cause. Wow! All three new steps working together!
